# Checklist: Essential steps to a successful job search

#### Step 1: First things to do

- Consult the guide Learning about Québec for information about the steps involved when integrating into Québec society. >>>
- When you arrive, sign up for a half-day group session called **Premières démarches d'installation**. >>>
- Apply to Service Canada for a social insurance number. >>>
- Apply for a Québec Health Insurance Card. >>>
- Find out about the local organizations that provide reception and integration services. >>>
- If necessary, find out about taking French courses (full time, part-time or online courses) and the eligibility requirements. >>>
- Check whether you qualify for an Objectif Intégration session, in order to familiarize yourself with the Québec workplace, Québec values and Québec cultural orientations. >>>

### Step 2: Assessing your job skills

Find out about the possibilities of carrying out your trade or occupation in the various regions of Québec, based on the available jobs.

#### Things to think about

- What are your professional objectives? (What kind of job are you searching for?)
- What skills do you have (schooling, work experience)?
  Are they connected with your professional objectives and do they meet labour market requirements?
- Are your job-search methods effective and up-todate?

#### Websites to consult for information

- Labour Market Information (LMI) Online (information about the job market, trades and occupations, sectors of activity, employers, job prospects by region) >>>
- Practising regulated professions and trades >>>
- Applying or not for an "évaluation comparative" of your studies (comparative evaluation) >>>
- Recognition of your secondary and college studies and competencies >>>
- ☐ Certificates of vocational qualification >>>



## **Step 3: Looking for a job**

Do you feel ready to start working? (Look at the results of your job skills assessment.)

If yes, continue your job-search activities. Consult the Emploi-Québec website, where you will find documents and links to websites related to searching for a job. You will also find links to the websites of organizations that offer employment assistance services such as job-search techniques. Verify whether you are eligible for these services.

	Consult the information documents and use the equipment in the Multiservice Room to help you in your job search.			
	You can meet with an employment assistance officer by telephone or in person. To sign up for an appointment, you must provide photo ID, your social insurance number and one of the following documents to prove your immigration status:  Proof of permanent residence (IMM 5292 or IMM 5688)  Permanent resident card  Canadian citizenship card  Letter indicating that you have been accepted for refugee claimant status.			
	When you go to the appointment with the employment assistance officer, bring to the appointment your résumé, and if possible, a copy of your diplomas and the "Évaluation comparative des études effectuées hors du Québec".			
	In order to participate in Emploi-Québec measures or services, you must have authorization from an employment assistance officer.
